PROPOSED PRACTICE DIRECTION - CIVIL COSTS

I refer to the above.

As you are aware, Supreme Court PD 4.7.2 of the Consolidated Practice Directions sets out a process for the provisional assessment of a bill of costs, intended to reduce the number of bills that proceed to assessment and result in a saving of costs for parties.

In the Magistrates Court of Western Australia, the Society understands that practitioners find the costs of the taxation process can often be significant having regarding to the quantum of bills filed.

The Law Society would therefore be grateful for your consideration of the attached draft Practice Direction, which includes a similar process to that in the Supreme Court, for adoption by the Magistrates Court.

In summary, the proposal:

- encourages Magistrates, where practical, to make fixed costs orders when determining Form 23 applications;
- gives guidance to practitioners on making submissions regarding costs for Form 23 applications (which I understand is already encouraged);
- provides for the assessment of a bill in the absence of the parties where no objection is made to the bill <u>and</u> the Registrar is satisfied that the amounts claimed in the bill are reasonable;
- sets out a process for the provisional assessment of a bill and the allowance of the amount of the provisional assessment if the parties make no objection to the provisional assessment; and
- sets out a process for making an objection to a provisional assessment with the result that the bill is listed for assessment in the usual way.

In our respectful view, the Practice Direction would provide parties with a more cost effective, and efficient, way to resolve disputes in relation to costs.

The Law Society is grateful for your consideration of the matter, and looks forward to hearing from you.
