Activating your Scheme Inclusion



For Individuals: How do I activate my Participation under the Scheme?

The Scheme is available to ordinary Law Society members who hold a current practising certificate.

However, the Scheme does not apply to:

- Corporate Legal Practitioners
- Government Legal Practitioners
- > Community Legal Practitioners

If any of the above practitioner categories relate to you, you are required to submit an exemption application. These may be completed online and are found on our website.

Once you are a current <u>Law Society member</u>, you may complete the easy steps below to activate your participation under the Professional Standards Scheme.

1. Complete the Scheme application online:

- ✓ New Members Online Form
- **2.** When we receive the form, we will check that all details are correct and that you have valid Professional Indemnity Insurance arrangements.

An invoice will then be issued to you with the Scheme fees.

3. Pay your invoice.

Once paid, we will be able to process the Scheme form and issue a letter of confirmation for participation under the Scheme. The Scheme is not retrospective and is applicable from date of payment. Requests for retrospective inclusion cannot be granted.

4. Disclose your Scheme participation.

You must ensure the <u>prescribed disclosure statement</u> is contained on all documents provided to clients or prospective clients that promote or advertise the practice. There is a fine of up to \$5,000 for non-disclosure in Western Australia.
